The game was an exciting encounter and was only decided at the death when the visitors scored a try in injury time. Final score was 10 v 15. Balbriggan had a raft of new players on the field. These included scrum-half Finn Howley, second row Chuka Uba, winger Taiwo Tibetan and hooker Stephen Dowling. It was also a first outing for Head Coach Brian Collins, who played at out-half. We also saw the welcome return of Sean Keogh whilst Conor Caldwell led the team out at the start of his fourth year in a row as captain.

The match also doubled as the annual Kettle Cup encounter which was originally played between Balbriggan and Delvin. The Kettle Cup, presented at the end of the match is played in honour of a Delvin and Balbriggan stalwart, the late Tom Kettle.
















Your Club Your Country
